In the Center of it All ~ 'Everything Chenango'

Welcome to Chenango County! Like the rest of Central New York, we all look forward to the change of each season, and after the long, cold winter, spring is an unparalleled favorite. The warmer weather allows us to venture into the great outdoors and enjoy the sunshine and a myriad of activities. Revel in a family adventure, explore the trail systems, and travel the picturesque roads to take in our beautiful landscape. Visit our historic spots and take respite in quiet little pubs and restaurants.

What makes us different? The outstanding beauty of our trails, the area lakes and streams, our small-town rural charm, the numerous parks, and most of all - the chance for relaxation no matter what option you choose.

Another of our well-deserved great outdoor assets is Bowman Lake State Park. Many campers have described Bowman Lake as a camper's paradise. A rural, natural setting in a section of New York State steeped in folklore and historic tradition. The 35-acre lake, located in the center of the park, is just 16 feet deep at its deepest point. Today, with 11,000 acres of State Department of Environmental Conservation forestland bordering the park, Bowman Lake retains a unique and special wilderness aspect for all to enjoy.


Considered by most as a family-fun vacation spot, campsites are gobbled up fast, and campers come from all over New York State and beyond to spend time in the woodland atmosphere and the remote 660 acres of the large, shaded campsites nestled beneath the loftv trees.

Want more of our outdoors? Another outdoor destination is The Greenway River Trails that started out as the "City of Norwich Greenbelt Park Project". This was envisioned as a public, multi-use, run-walk-bike trail system along the Chenango River within the city limits. We see it as a public destination with an overlook to sit, relax, watch the river, observe wildlife, and just enjoy the outdoors - right within the City of Norwich.

From the Greenway River Trails, the Greenway Conservancy group has moved to another location to expand a new outdoor arena that is in the making. What was previously coined as the "Stone Quarry" has now become a cherished recreational destination for hiking, biking, snowshoeing, cross-country skiing, mountain biking, exploration and storytelling by generations of Norwich children and families. The additional quarry property that was recently acquired by the group will form the centerpiece of a community forest and recreational area that will be open to the public. Paramount in making this initiative come alive are the miles of new trails for favorite outdoor activities and the wide-open spaces that will help to increase the resources that will be of value in our area and add to the economic impact of all of Chenango County.

For nearly a century, observers watched the forests of New York State from more than 100 fire towers perched atop the highest peaks, searching for the dangerous, telltale signs of forest fires. There were 19 fire towers in the Catskill region and 52 in the Adirondacks.

We are in DEC region 7 in Chenango County and the Berry Hill Fire Tower is located near McDonough State Forest here in Chenango County. Following the recent rehabilitation of Berry Hill fire tower, which included upgrades to enhance safety and accessibility, the tower is now open to the public year-round from sunrise to sunset. At an elevation of 1,960 feet, the fire tower is one of the highest points in Chenango County and the view stretches into the counties of Broome, Cortland, Delaware, Madison, Oneida, Onondaga, Otsego, and Tioga. We encourage you to pack a lunch, drink, and proper equipment and hike to a fire tower where the views are spectacular no matter what season you visit.



Prefer indoor activities? They also abound here, and we have the Northeast Classic Car Museum, The Chenango County Historical Museum, art galleries, and our very own wineries and breweries that serve a myriad of craft brews and specialty wines. This summer we will be hosting our inaugural Wine, Beer, and Food Festival that is shaping up to be a top tourism activity in our area.

It's true we don't have amusement parks, casino's, sports stadiums, or an ocean view. What we do have is natural beauty, rivers, lakes, arts and theatre, museums, live music, hiking trails, wildlife and miles and miles of state land. We all need to take pride and some initiative in highlighting our communities. Together we have the power to steer the conversation, be positive about the amazing place we live in and what makes us unique and special. What hidden gems do you have in your backyard? Where do you go locally for a fun day out? When friends and family visit, where do you bring them? Those of us who live here every day take for granted the beauty and attractions all around us. We want everyone to know how privileged we are here in Chenango County.


COLORSCAPE CHENANGO ARTS FESTIVAL

ROLLING ANTIQUERS CAR SHOW - MAY May 28-29, 2022: 55th annual



SHERBURNE PAGEANT OF BANDS June 3-4, 2022: 73rd annual

The Sherburne Pageant of Bands is one of the oldest and largest contest of its kind in the northeastern United States. The pageant, which takes place the first weekend in June, has grown from less than a dozen bands in the early years to over three times that amount. The number of spectators has grown from just a few thousand to well over 15,000, and sometimes nearly 20,000.

Since the first pageant, over 200 different schools have sent bands to compete at the annual Sherburne event. While the pageant has mainly featured bands from New York State, others have come from Pennsylvania, New Jersey and New Hampshire as well as from such Midwestern states as Iowa and South Dakota.
