Parades, reenactments, and commemorations of the founding fathers focus on the hope and heroism that have come to symbolize the birth of a new nation, while largely disregarding its decisive impact on Indigenous nations. Artists Peter Jamison, Sayokla Kindness, Carla Hemlock, Shelley Niro, Trevor Brant, and others will offer their insightful, at times divergent, viewpoints on this foundational American anniversary. Exhibit features sculpture, beadwork, painting, digital works, and more.

2026 Special Exhibitions: Held over from last Season "Separated but Unbroken: The Haudenosaunee Boarding School Experience"

"Separated but Unbroken: The Haudenosaunee Boarding School Experience" explores the lasting impact of the Thomas Indian School, once located on the Cattaraugus Reservation south of Buffalo, NY, and the Mohawk Institute near Branford, Ontario. These institutions, which enrolled a significant number of Haudenosaunee students, were part of a larger system that sought to erase Indigenous identities while deeply shaping the lives of those who endured them. Co-curated by Erin Keaton (Mohawk), the exhibition sheds light on Haudenosaunee resilience.

Logjammin' VI

For the past five years the lager faithful have gathered in Philadelphia for Logjammin', hosted by lager legends, Human Robot. This year they've passed the torch, and we're honored to host the first destination version here at Wayward Lane Brewing.

On Saturday, June 6th we're welcoming more than 50 breweries to our farm brewery in the rolling hills of the Schoharie Valley for a full day dedicated to lagerbier. Breweries from across the country will be pouring their finest lagers while bands play throughout the day on our two outdoor stages, with food trucks and pop-ups keeping everyone well fed. The whole thing unfolds across our 65-acre farm alongside our rustic taproom and open outdoor venue space. At its core, Logjammin' is about bringing brewers and drinkers together to celebrate great lager. That tradition continues here. It's a chance to taste a ridiculous amount of great beer in one place and hang out with the people who make it.

As always, Logjammin' VI will be a charitable event, this year raising funds to support the Open Space Institute. OSI is a prominent nonprofit conservation organization founded in 1974, dedicated to protecting land for public recreation, clean water, wildlife habitat, and climate protection. Operating primarily in the Eastern U.S. and Canada, OSI has helped protect over 2.5 million acres through land acquisition, grants, and community-based partnerships. As a rural farm brewery rooted in agriculture, this mission resonates deeply with us. Land stewardship is central to who we are and we're stoked to align Logjammin' with that effort. General Admission is \$65 and gets you into the festival from 1–5pm. All guests will receive a Logjammin' VI tasting glass for the day.

VIP tickets are \$95 and include early entry at 12pm for an extra hour of lager drinking before the gates open to everyone else. VIP guests will also receive an upgraded Logjammin' VI tasting glass, a commemorative festival poster, and free 4-pack of the Human Robot x Wayward Lane collab beer released day of the festival.

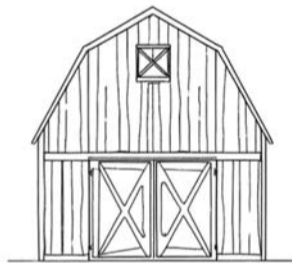

Founded in 1979, the Allegany River Indian Dancers have become one of the best-known Native dance groups in the United States and Canada today. The group has traveled throughout North America, sharing traditional Iroquois social dances. The group is also well known for its repertoire of Intertribal "Pow wow" style dances. Their performances often feature Bill Crouse's hoop dance. This style of dance involves 30 hoops used to make various formations or designs representing things from nature. Through group performances (which often include audience participation) and lecture presentations, this group has taught large audiences about Seneca history and culture. "One of the town's best kept secrets..." The original double locks of the Old Erie Canal. The site is accessible next to the bike path on Bridge Street along Dump Road which is a dirt road. Marked with a historical marker. Picnic tables on site.

This enlarged double lock is located on the Erie Canal on the south side of the barge canal across from the village of St Johnsville NY, in the town of Minden. You must travel 3/4 of a mile down Dump Road to get to it. A sign on Bridge Street marks the entrance to the road. Terry Potoczny and his team of volunteers have spent countless hours cleaning out the old lock. It is under restoration and was once filled with water and the floating cargoes that made the Erie Canal commercially successful, in November 1999 these double locks instead held tons of garbage including 125 tires, one snowmobile, a motorcycle, assorted bicycle parts, refrigerators, kitchen stoves, and a television. Like other segments of the Erie Canal across the state, these locks are being rescued and restored by local preservation groups, businesses, and governments. Connected by paths and trails, they serve as links to the past and recreational respite for the present.

The locks history, as researched by Tom Grasso. It was lengthened during the Winter-Spring of 1887-1888. The contract was awarded to Soule and Raynor of Syracuse who also lengthened Lock 32 at Fort Plain. Their bid was \$24,620.50 for Lock 33 and \$24,111.50 for Lock 32. It was lengthened at the head of the berm side instead of the foot probably because Lock 33 is located at the end of a curve and lengthening it at the foot would make the lower end of the lock stick out into the curve taking away from the arc of the bend rendering it sharper and for double headers this could be a big problem.

The Lily of the Mohawks. Kateri Tekakawitha, was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1980. Kateri lived her teenage years at the site of her shrine, which includes a rustic chapel in an 18th-century Dutch barn and displays of artifacts form an on-site archeological excavation of an entire Mohawk village.

Route 5 at the intersection of Route 67 in Fort Johnson, NY, about 1 mile west of Amsterdam, NY

Old Fort Johnson, the 1749 fortified limestone home of Sir William Johnson, is representative of the best of colonial architecture. No other home of a prominent New York citizen of the colonial period has survived so untouched by the changes of style and time. This National Historic Landmark is owned and operated by the Montgomery County Historical Society, a private, non-profit organization established to collect and preserve Mohawk Valley history. It is the Society's intent to present the Fort as close to the way it was during Sir William's lifetime as can now be determined. Most furnishings are contemporary to Johnson's time, and a number of items are from the Johnson family. The Fort also houses exhibits which include a collection of Native American artifacts focusing on the Mohawk Valley; the Betsey Reynolds Voorhees room which articulates the life and times of a prominent 19th century lady; the attic which holds pieces that tell the history of Montgomery County and a rare 18th century privy.

The Landis Arboretum is a public garden spanning 548-acres into both Schoharie and Montgomery Counties. FULTON Gateway to the Adirondacks

The splendor of the seasons comes naturally to Fulton County, where the Adirondack Park meets the Mohawk Valley. In an area so varied, beauty is abundant in spring, summer, winter and fall, and the slate of activities is equally complete.

Fulton County in the spring and summer is shimmering with an abundance of lakes and streams for fishing, boating and swimming. The mountains and valleys boast quiet sylvan paths lined with pine needles and maple leaves.

In this land of nature's bounty, the number of activities is only as limited as your imagination. Let's say a brisk walk in the cool dew in the morning, a round of golf on any of several courses in the afternoon, then a moonlit cruise on one of 44 lakes. Folks who appreciate the indoors as much as the scenic outdoors can take in the historic sights, like Johnson Hall Historic Site, the former home of French and Indian War hero Sir William Johnson. Events are planned year-round at the Rice Homestead as well, a 1790 Colonial homestead.

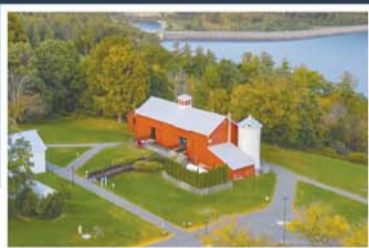
